President's Report **Council Meeting of Tuesday, August 6, 2019**

Good afternoon Council Members, Ladies and Gentlemen:

COASTAL PROGRAM – We have partnered with Nunez College to launch a new academic program in Coastal Studies and GIS Technology in the Kane Technology Building. The program delivers skills and competencies in coastal studies that utilize the latest, cutting-edge technologies such as drones and Geographic Information Systems. FINANCE – Congratulations to Finance Department on completing the 2018 audit. The parish received a clean opinion (unmodified opinion) and no findings for the second year in the history of Parish Government.

FISHERIES TASK FORCE – Mike Bayham, John Lane and the Eddie Chagnard, Chairman of the Louisiana United Crabbers Alliance met with members of Congress and their staffers last week as we continue to press Washington in an attempt to secure federal relief for damages caused by floodwaters released into St. Bernard's estuaries.

GROUNDBREAKINGS – We recently broke ground on Heights Neighborhood Park in Arabi which will serve as a trailhead to the 40 Arpent walking/bike path and will feature a pedestrian bridge, a covered pavilion, decorative plaza, benches, picnic tables, and bike racks.

GRAND OPENINGS – We held a grand opening of the 40 Arpent Fishing Pier at 8201 Benjamin Street. The 40 x 16 foot pier is part of the St. Bernard Parish Bikeway and Pedestrian Plan which calls for construction of a multi-purpose trail, known as the 40 Arpent Trail, adjacent to the observatory and the new fishing pier.

We also celebrated the opening of Blue Bird Park in Chalmette. This park emphasizes special needs facilities and a universal playground design with 34 different accessible play unit components, an accessible covered picnic area and specially designed handicapped restrooms.

PUBLIC WORKS – There are several waterline projects taking place throughout the parish. There is also a Reggio Booster Station project and bridge replacement projects over the 20 Arpent Canal at Mumphrey Road and Gallo Drive. The bridges are scheduled to be completed in November.

RECREATION – The Recreation Department recently hosted two free basketball clinics. The first was held with Mitchell Robinson of the New York Knicks and the second with New Orleans Pelicans. Both camps were well attended with over 200 kids participating. Volleyball Jamboree will be held Tuesday and Wednesday. The four zones are taking registration for Tackle Football through Friday, August 9th.
