President's Report

November 4, 2025

To the Honorable St. Bernard Parish Council and Residents,

I'm pleased to share this update and highlight another productive month for St. Bernard Parish Government.

Recent work includes a new roof installation at Pump Station 1 to protect critical equipment and the addition of exterior fans at the Animal Shelter to help keep our animals and staff cool during warmer months. Our in-house crews continue skimming ditches and clearing drain lines and catch basins parish-wide to improve water flow through the system. On average, the team cleans about 6,000 feet of drainage lines each week—ongoing work that reduces standing water, improves drainage, and keeps our neighborhoods functioning properly.

At Val Riess Park, work has begun on fields 5–8, marking the next phase of the turf-installation project. Asphalt patching crews have started measuring and prioritizing repairs, with twelve locations scheduled for completion this week. At the Farmsite/Torres Pump Station, crews are installing piping in the wet well and expect to set pumps soon. Fire Station #11 held its pre-construction meeting last week, and work begins this week. Meanwhile, the Riverbend Force Main project is moving forward with the final drill now underway, covering 2,220 feet of 18-inch pipe.

Last week I joined the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (LaDOTD) for a ribbon-cutting ceremony celebrating the completion of the LA 47 "Green Bridge" Rehabilitation Project. Originally opened in 1967, the bridge underwent a \$47 million rehabilitation that restored and repainted its steel structure and returned its iconic green color. DOTD's work on the Green Bridge keeps LA 47 safe and dependable, a vital lifeline for commuters in St. Bernard Parish. A reliable LA 47 remains one of our most important links to jobs, emergency services, and evacuation routes, keeping St. Bernard connected to the region. This rehabilitation makes that connection safer and stronger for our families, first responders, and businesses. I extend my thanks to Secretary Ledet, the DOTD team, and our past and present elected officials for getting it done.

Several new and renewed business permits were issued last month, underscoring steady growth and confidence in our local small-business economy. Please join me in welcoming and supporting the following businesses: Southern Real Estate Professionals, Jackson Hewitt Tax Service, Premier Motors, Labyrinth
