**FAMILY FEST** – The Inaugural Family Fest was a huge success. The event included a gumbo cook-off, as well as other food, drinks and kids activities. Those who attended enjoyed music entertainment by Cypress Pop Trio and Bucktown All-Stars. The proceeds raised will benefit the parish's four booster clubs.

**COASTAL** - We will again host the semiannual St. Bernard Seafood Market at Delacroix Pier **on Saturday, June 1<sup>st</sup>** from **9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. (or while supplies last)** at the Delacroix Fishing Pier (5565 Delacroix Highway). **RECREATION** – The Recreation Department will host a memorial day Tournament at Val Riess with 90 teams participating. Coming in July at Val Riess will be the New Orleans Pelicans Junior Training Camp and two Baseball World Series.

The St. Bernard Parish Film and TV Department was awarded with a Gold Telly for the History of the De La Ronde Plantation piece that is currently airing on the government access channel. This is the highest honor that can be awarded. For the past 40 years, the Telly Awards has annually showcased the best work created within television and across video, for all screens. Receiving over 12,000 entries from all 50 states and 5 continents, Telly Award winners represent work from some of the most respected advertising agencies, television stations, production companies and publishers from around the world.
